### **ADMISSIONS CRITERIA AND PROCESS**

Eligibility Applications are accepted from 8th grade boys enrolled in parochial, independent, and public schools, as well as from

qualified transfer applicants in 9th, 10th, and 11th grade.

Criteria Applicants are evaluated on academic performance in junior high school course work, co-curricular involvement, academic

recommendations, results on the High School Placement Test and other standardized tests, and on written essays.
