- Bellarmine students are not able to "double up" in core academic areas until the senior year as is possible at other schools. An essential part of our education in the Jesuit tradition lies in the required religious courses and in our requirements for Christian Service each year. We know that colleges and universities value the character our alumni bring to their campuses resulting from their Bellarmine education, discernment, reflection, and service.
- Due to faculty staffing and academic restraints, some seniors were not able to take as many advanced courses as they wished. Seniors are being encouraged to make note in their Common Application if they ran into scheduling conflicts.
- We offer a total of **23 Advanced Placement and 14 Honors courses**. Our limitations on the number of honors/AP courses students may take remains in place and are scheduled based on placement and counseling: one course in the freshman year; three in the sophomore year and four in the junior and senior years only if they are also scheduled with free periods.
- Each of our Bellarmine students, following our theme of **A Faith That Does Justice**, are involved in service in our own region but throughout the world, including urban and rural plunges, and immersions at the Kino Border, in Alabama, El Salvador, Guatemala and Ecuador.
- Our **Speech and Debate Program** is a top ranked program in the US, having also won the California State Championship. In 2024, 27 students went to Nationals and 39 went to the California State Championship across 10 different events.
- The Theatre Program is vibrant, with our students behind the scenes in building and production, and/or cast in the following dramas, musicals and comedies over the past two years: A Gentleman's Guide to Love and Murder, Chicago, Antigone, The Wedding Singer, Little Shop of Horrors and Clue. This season, Bellarmine will present Jesus Christ Superstar, Spelling Bee and Network.
- 1356 student athletes participated in inter-scholastic sports last year and 343 were 2-sport athletes. For WCAL: champions in cross country, water polo, swimming, tennis, wrestling, golf, and track and field. In CCS, champions in cross country, 3rd place in golf and 2nd place in track and field. Basketball and volleyball made it to Nor-Cal CIF competition.
- Our **FRC Robotics** "Cheesy Poofs" Team came in second at the World Championships, competing against 600 other teams and winning the Excellence in Engineering Award. The FTC teams were in their first-year in 2023-24, and competed successfully in our region, picking up two design and one innovation awards along the way.

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA AND PROCESS

Eligibility

Applications are accepted from 8th grade boys enrolled at parochial, independent and public schools, as well as from qualified transfer applicants in 9th, 10th, 11th grade.

Criteria

Applicants are evaluated on academic performance in junior high school course work, co-curricular involvement, academic recommendations, results on the High School Placement Test and other standardized tests, and on written essays.
